2017 has been another banner year for CEQA legal and policy developments! As always, California's pre-eminent CEQA attorneys, planners, and experts will provide you with the latest CEQA insights, trends, and practice advice.

At the same time, the Legislature continued to debate whether affordable housing projects should bypass CEQA review with "by right" approvals in response to the housing crisis. The Legislature also considered significant cutbacks to the use of land use initiatives to bypass the CEQA process.
