### **Dear Colleague:**

2017 has been another banner year for CEQA legal and policy developments! As always, California's pre-eminent CEQA attorneys, planners, and experts will provide you with the latest CEOA insights, trends, and practice advice.

And once again, the appellate courts have published numerous decisions that change CEQA practice, such as refining the definition of ministerial actions that are exempt from CEQA.

At the same time, the Legislature continued to debate whether affordable housing projects should bypass CEQA review with "by right" approvals in response to the housing crisis. The Legislature also considered significant cutbacks to the use of land use initiatives to bypass the CEQA process.
